Gather 10 candles. Repeat the nursery rhyme, but instead of saying jumping over 'the candlestick', say the rhyme inserting the numeral for the number of candlesticks the child is actually jumping over – 1, 2, 3, etc. Make edible shadows! Have your child form a shape outline with the butterscotch chips. Using chocolate chips, have them reform the same shape
		 <i>Nursery Rhyme:</i> Introduce, read/chant, and discuss 'Jack Be Nimble'. <i>Phonemic Awareness:</i> Segmenting Sentences - Jump over a candlestick each time a word in the nursery rhyme is said. 	 Introduce Letter 'Oo' using the Picture Review Sheet and the letter 'Oo Song'. Relate to the Bible Story. <i>Environmental Print:</i> Place a piece of environmental print on the "I Can Read" board. (<i>Exp. Oreo's, etc.</i>) Ask your child 'Can you read this?' Then let your child hunt for other print to add to the I Can Read board that starts with that same letter. Print can be added at any time during the week! <i>Letter Art:</i> Glue Cheerios onto the Letter Oo outline to create 'Cheerio Oo's! 	 blocks, drinking glass, fabric scraps, cardboard, plastic wrap, plastic bags, plastic containers, sandpaper, etc. Have your child shine a flashlight at each object. Sort the objects according to if the light shone through the object (translucent) or not. Science Art : Read <u>What Makes a Shadow</u> by Clyde Bulla and then make shadow art puppets! Trace a few shapes, color, and cut them out. Attach to a Popsicle stick. Turn off the lights. Turn on a flashlight and shine it at the stick puppets as you move them about!

Hunt for the corresponding lowercase letter in other names also on display. Point to and read all of the names on the name wall so far. Letter Sort: 	 Review Game or Flashcards for colors, shapes, numerals, name, birthday, phone number, address, and letters studied Calendar/Oral Counting with Movement (Same daily.) Math: Focus: Classification Provide a small and a large box and various candles. Have your child sort the small candles into the small box and the large candles into the large box. You could also have them sort by color, scent, or texture of the candles! Math Art: Reread 'Jack Be Nimble'. Make an edible candlestick. Mix white frosting with yellow food coloring (flame). Dip the tip of a pretzel rod (candlestick) into the food coloring. Place the pretzel rod in a no bake cookie (candle holder). 	

	Alliteration -Show a puppet wearing a hat and explain that he likes things that begin with the same sound as the picture that is on his hat. 	 Bible Memory Songs and Movement: Review Songs. Nursery Rhyme: Reread/chant, and discuss 'Jack Be Nimble'. 	 <i>Letter Recognition Focus:</i> Review Letter 'Oo' using the Picture Review Sheet and the letter 'Oo Song'. Relate to the Bible Story. <i>Tactile Formation:</i> Have your child form Oo's with craft pom poms. Also have them practice forming Oo's with crayons on large chart paper. Encourage your child to say 'Oo' says / ŏ / or sing the 'Oo Song' as they form. 	• Science: Focus: Properties of Candles/Light Sources Review 'Jack Be Nimble'. Talk about why we use candles. Read a book about other sources of light such as <u>Eli's Night Light</u> by Liz Rosenburg. Then show pictures of other sources of light, such as lamps, flashlights, lanterns, decorative tree lights, fireplaces, light houses, campfires, and the sun!	
	• Phonemic Awareness: Syllable Splitting and Counting - Reread the nursery rhyme. Then, on another reading, have your child, slowly, alternate slapping their knees with clapping their hands for each syllable used in the nursery rhyme. Then, read just one word from the nursery rhyme. Have your child turn a flashlight on/off as each syllable is said.	 <i>Sound Sort:</i> Sort pictures according to their sound – / ŏ / or not /ŏ/. <i>Name Practice:</i> Show your child his/her name with the correct upper and lowercase letters on a laminated name card. Have your child roll playdough into long 'snakes' and place them on top of each letter in their name. 	• <i>Math:</i> <i>Focus: Numeral Recognition and Counting</i> <i>Sunlight Source Math</i> - Set out a paper plate, nine yellow rectangles, and numeral cards 0-9. Have your child choose a numeral card, place it on the middle of the paper plate, and then count out the corresponding number of rectangles to place around the edge of the plate.
