	Theme: Bubbles Bible Memory: Proverbs 18:10 The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous run to it and are safe.	W3, D1	Theme Story: <u>Pop!: A Book About Bubbles</u> by Kimberly Brubaker Bradley Theme Related Activity: How can we make bubbles? Experiment moving in different ways to see which way makes the best bubbles!	Math: Place one bingo dauber stamp in each square of a grid in order to practice 1 to 1 correspondence Art: Attach white sticker dots to blue paper. Place glue on each dot. Sprinkle glitter over the paper. Shake excess glitter and you have glitter bubbles!	Songs/Movement: ‘Bubbles’	• Play in an outdoor wading pool. • Take a bubble bath! • Pop bubble wrap using your hands, feet, elbow, etc!
		W3, D2	Theme Story: <u>Bubble Trouble</u> by Mary Packard Theme Related Activity: Bubble Bags- In three different ziplock freezer bags, place styling gel, shaving cream with food coloring, and liquid soap. Watch bubbles form and pop as the bags are squeezed!	Math: Use ‘The Bubble Song’ to make a Bubble Counting Book. Art: Paint a large section of bubble wrap. When done, place a sheet on top of the painted wrap and press down gently. Lift to see your bubble prints!	Songs/Movement: ‘The Bubble Hop’	• Make bubble bottles to shake and observe ! Use water, bubble solutions, bubble bath, shampoo, vegetable oil, etc.
		W4, D1	Theme Story: <u>The Scrubby Bubbly Car Wash</u> by Irene O’Garden Theme Related Activity: -Sequence pictures of what happens at a car wash -Set up a car wash for outside ride on toys! Talk about what they will need (water, buckets, towels, sponges, etc.) and then wash those play cars!	Math: Using a bucket of water and a paintbrush, paint the sidewalk, fence, etc. using long and short lines, wavy and straight lines, etc. Art: Tape a large piece of white roll paper to a fence. Have three different bottles of bubble solution – adding a different color of food coloring to each. Stand very close to the paper and blow. The bubbles pop on the paper and make circular bubble prints!	Songs/Movement: ‘Water Song’	• Place shaving cream on a laminated picture of a dirty car. Kids can ‘wash’ the car and also practice making shapes!
		W4, D2	Theme Story: <u>Scrubba-Dub</u> by Nancy Van Laan, <u>Bubbles, Bubbles</u> by Kathi Appelt Theme Related Activity: Give baby dolls bubble baths! Fill a baby bath tub with water and some bubble bath. Provide towels, wash clothes, small bath toys, etc.	Math: Do some experiments with a sponge and water. Float it to use as a raft for Little People and/or transfer water from 1 pan to another just by squeezing the sponge. Art: Paint with shampoo! Mix 3 tsp. shampoo with a little water and food coloring. Beat until thick and creamy. Paint!	Songs/Movement: ‘Bubbles All Around’
